Tim asked about SNHD's internal process for importing labs as his agency is in the middle of a set up process. They send lab files to TriYoung on Fridays (weekly). Ronny mentioned their internal lab process import process is monthly. Jessica highlighted and clarified that we are facing two separate issues with lab data. The first issue is the lag in data with HIV Surveillance (external process) and internal lab import processes at each agency that may be facing data integration issues. Jessica asked Thomas if he has seen this in other jurisdictions. Thomas confirmed that there are data synchronization and data validation issues that occur and advised providers to continue keeping an eye on their data by running their data through their QIPs to really look at the performance measures and taking ownership of that data. Jessica reminded providers that they are the people who know consumers and services being provided. Jessica referred to a military saying, "inspect what you are expect." We are collectively looking forward to the end of Cycle 1 outcomes.

Jessica Introduced Jose Alcazar, the Program Management Analyst and newest member of our team. Jose is looking forward to meeting everyone and working closely with everybody.
